Cedar Unit

The goal of this unit is to learn about the healing, protective and medicinal properties of cedar.

Lushootseed

žpay?ac − Cedar Tree

stidg^wəd – Cedar bough

Activity Instructions



- 1. Check your yard for any xpay?ac (cedar tree), if you have one at your house, you can use that, if not, take a drive or a walk and see if you can identify a cedar tree to ?uləxəd (harvest) from. If you need to travel, make sure you have water, snacks, a bag for harvested cedar, and some scissors.
- 2. Once you have found a xpay?ac (cedar tree) make some observations. This is a good time to use Lushootseed: stab ti?ə? (What is this?), stab čəxw ?əsšudxw (What do you see?), ?əs?əxidalus ti?ə? (What color is this?)
- 3. Say a prayer and thank the tree (t'igwicid xpay?ac) before beginning to harvest.
- 4. Cut or peel off the stidg^wəd (cedar bough), get pieces that are from 6-10 inches long. ?uləxəd (gather) at least one piece of stidg^wəd (cedar bough) for each person participating in the activity.
- 5. When you get home or to a place where you will be doing your craft, lay out the stidg^wəd (cedar boughs). If they are wet, pat them dry. Lay one piece out and lay a piece of paper on top of it. Emboss the silhouette stidg^wəd (cedar bough) onto the paper by laying a crayon on it side and rubbing it against the paper lightly.
- 6. Look at the embossings together and notice the patterns of ×pay?ac. Share what you know about the medicine ×pay?ac offers and discuss any questions you have or what you might want to learn more about.
