Activity Instructions



- Talk as a ʔiišəd (family) about what each person knows about local tatačulbix^{wal}ʔtx^w (large animal habitats) and where we may go to experience those tatačulbix^w (large animals) in their habitats.
- There are many places around dx^wlilap (Tulalip) that offer views into titčulbix^{wal}ʔtx^w (small animal habitats) like the hatchery, the ʔilg^{wi}ʔ (beach), or even the bridge crossing q^{wə}l' sidəʔ d^{zə}ʔix^w (Quil Ceda Creek) are great areas to possibly see titčulbix^w (small animals) that are important during pədt'əs (winter).
- Activities like bird watching or visiting the tatačulbix^{wali}ʔ (zoo) could also be a possible destination if you are unsure of local tatačulbix^{wal}ʔtx^w (large animal habitats). You can decide together where to explore and observe titčulbix^w (small animals) in their habitat during the pədt'əs (winter season)!
- Be on the lookout for important tatačulbix^w (large animal) markers, like čəsadbid (tracks), ʔalʔalʔal (homes), or even marks on trees/plants, these will show what kind of titčulbix^w (small animals) live there and even how they live their lives.



- If you like, group members can take pictures or draw pictures of the animals you see along the way.
