- Go d^zəlaxadbid (visit) a lulítəd (Elder), it can be a family lulítəd (Elder) or a community lulítəd (Elder).
- Meeting a luĩ⁄təd (Elder) can be done at your ʔalʔal (home), their ʔalʔal (home), or in a different space entirely.
- gʷəwilid̥ʷ (Politely ask) them to share a syəhub (story) or even discuss their day.
- If you wanted to ləlal'xtx^w (record) the luX'təd (Elder) sharing their syəhub (story), be sure to ask beforehand since many ?aci4talbix^w (people) can feel uneasy/upset at being ləlal'xtx^w (recorded).
- Since many ?aci⁴talbix^w (people) have access to s^wq^wi?aadači? (smartphones), most anyone can ləlal'xtx^w (record) by themselves but if you want a higher quality sləlal'xtx^w (recording), ask the Language Department for help.
