- Take your ?iišəd (family) on a s?ibəš (walk) around your own ?al?al?alič (neighborhood). See the nearby sights that you see every day and talk about what stories they might tell.
- In asking for these stories, ?iišəd (families) can see that syəhub (stories) can even come from ourselves, not just a "dxwsyəhubtxw" (Storyteller)". We are all dxwsyəhubtxw" (Storytellers).
- ?əslaxdxw (Remember) to take care for qil'qil'bid (cars) on the šəgwl (road), people's privacy around their ?al?al?al (homes), and the local tatačulbixw (animals) like sqwəbqwəbay?/pispispis (dogs/cats) or even wildlife like sqwigwəc/kwagwiced (deer/elk).
- While la?ibaš (walking), wiliqw (ask) each other about places of interest like "who lives there? / my friend lives there. / Your grandma once met someone right over there."
