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### **Activity Instructions**



- 1. Sit down as a family(?iišəd) and review regalia vocabulary for this activity.
- 2. Discuss regalia as a family (?iišəd) and express what regalia means to each of you.
- 3. Review the examples of Tulalip (dxwlilap) people's (sduhubš) regalia (qičalića?). Pass them around the family (?iišəd) and make sure to take notes and remember what you liked about each piece of clothing.
- 4. If you have your own pieces of regalia now would be a good time to show them or leave them out so other family member (?iišəd) could look at them for inspiration.
- 5. Print out the Coast Salish form shapes, the headband (xwəxwqəlaqid) cut out, hat (siqw) cut out, the shawl (ləsal) cut out and the vest (hədaxadikw) cut out. Have each of your family members (7iisəd) design their regalia.
- 6. You can use markers, pencils, crayons to color it. Or you can do it collage style with different color papers or magazines, using Coast Salish shapes and forms.
- 7. After you have designed your shawls (ləšal), headbands (x̄wəx̄wqəlaqid), hats (s̄iqw) and vests (hədax̄adikw) you can share them with your family (?iis̄əd).
- 8. These designs can be used to make regalia for the First Salmon Ceremony (s?əsqwu? ?ə ti hikw si?ab yubəč)
